

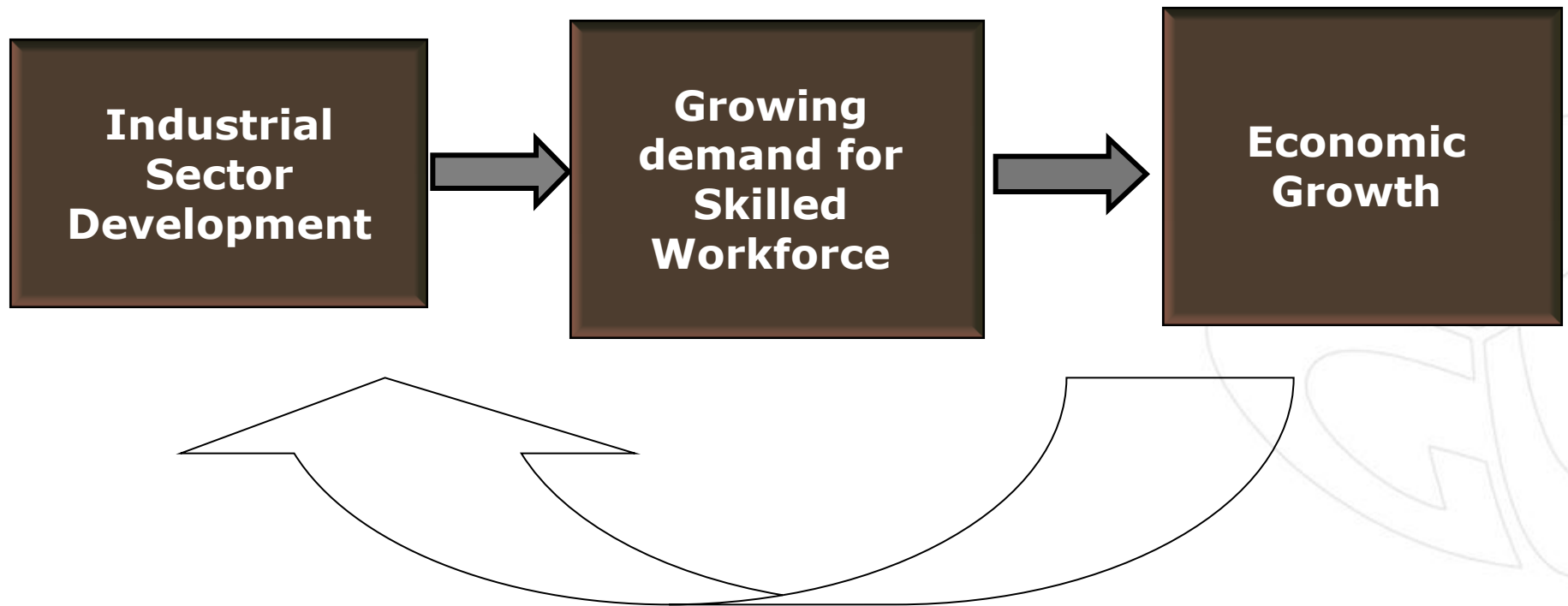

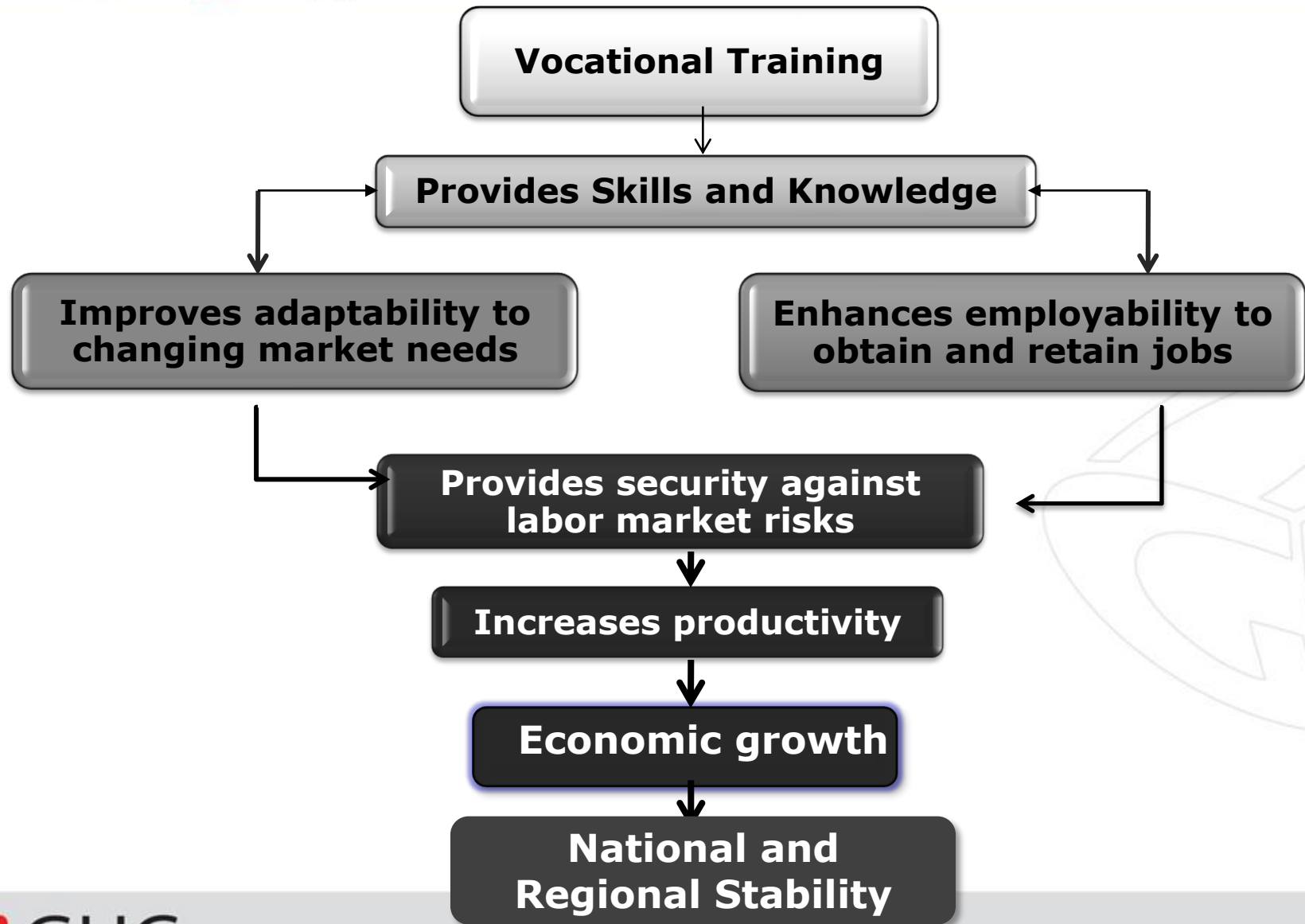

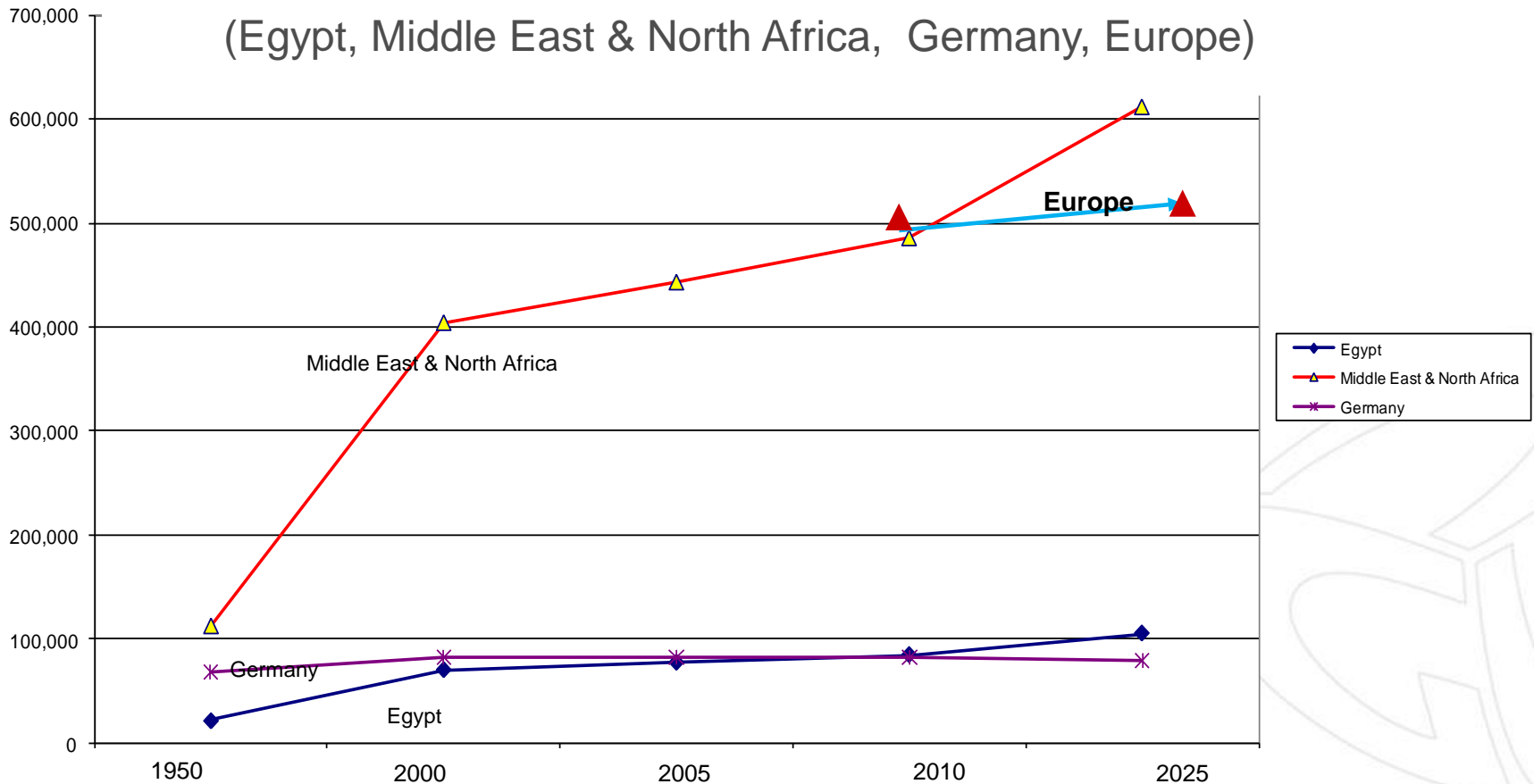




Comparison of Projected Increase in Population/ Labor Force

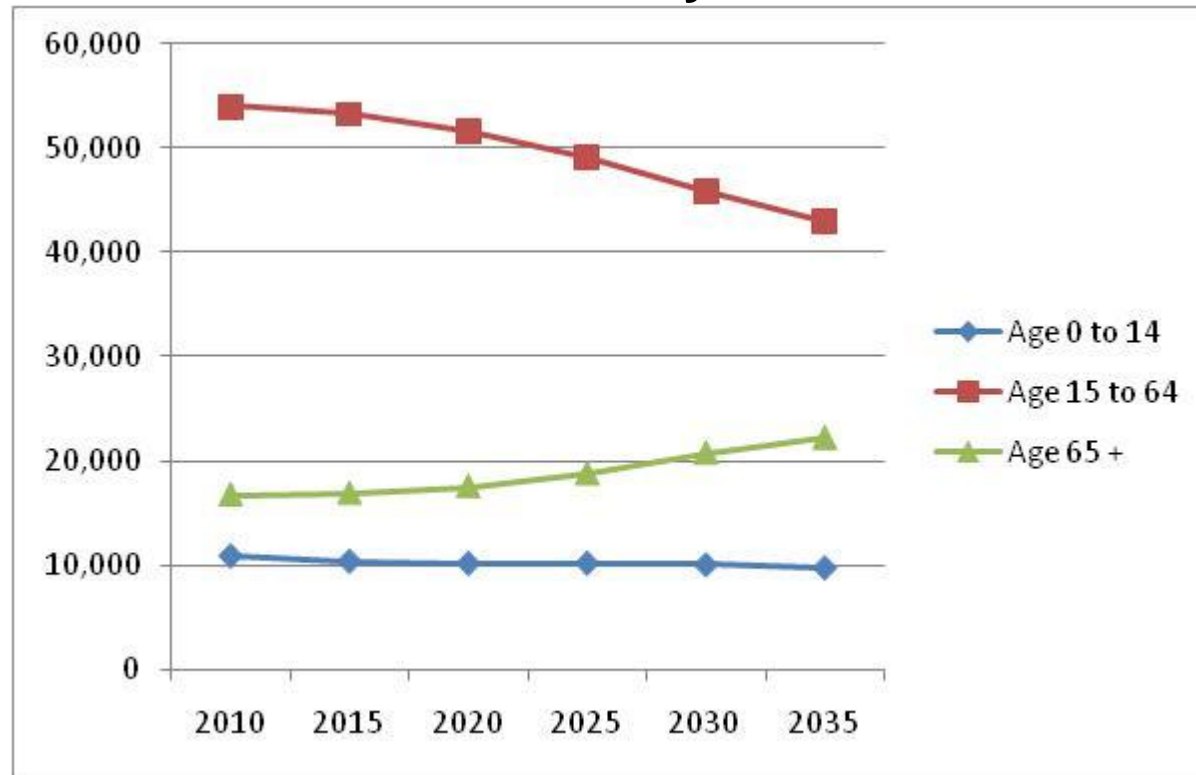

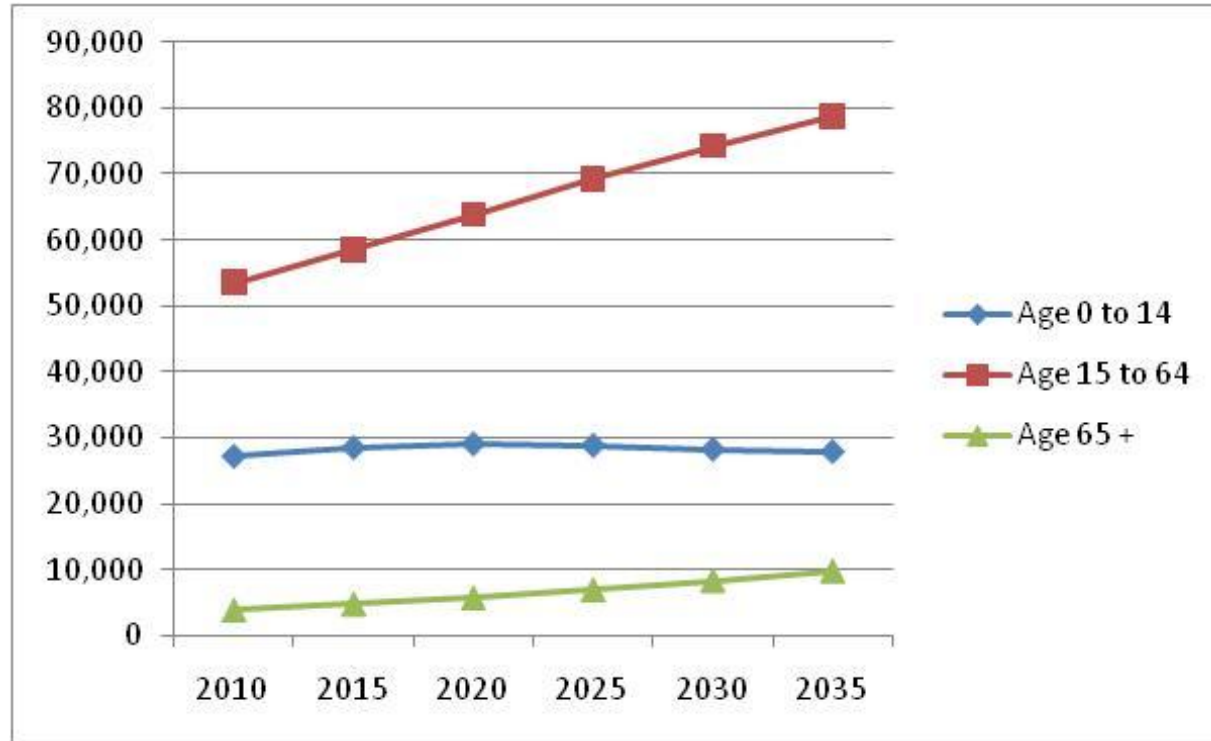

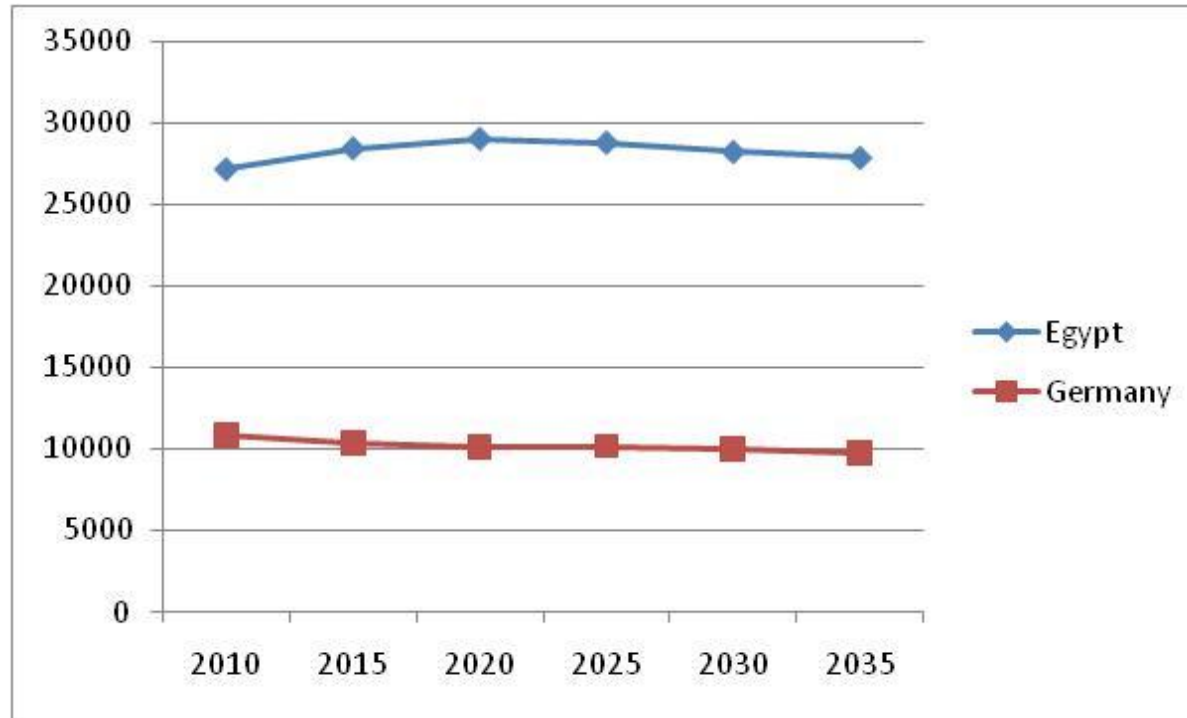

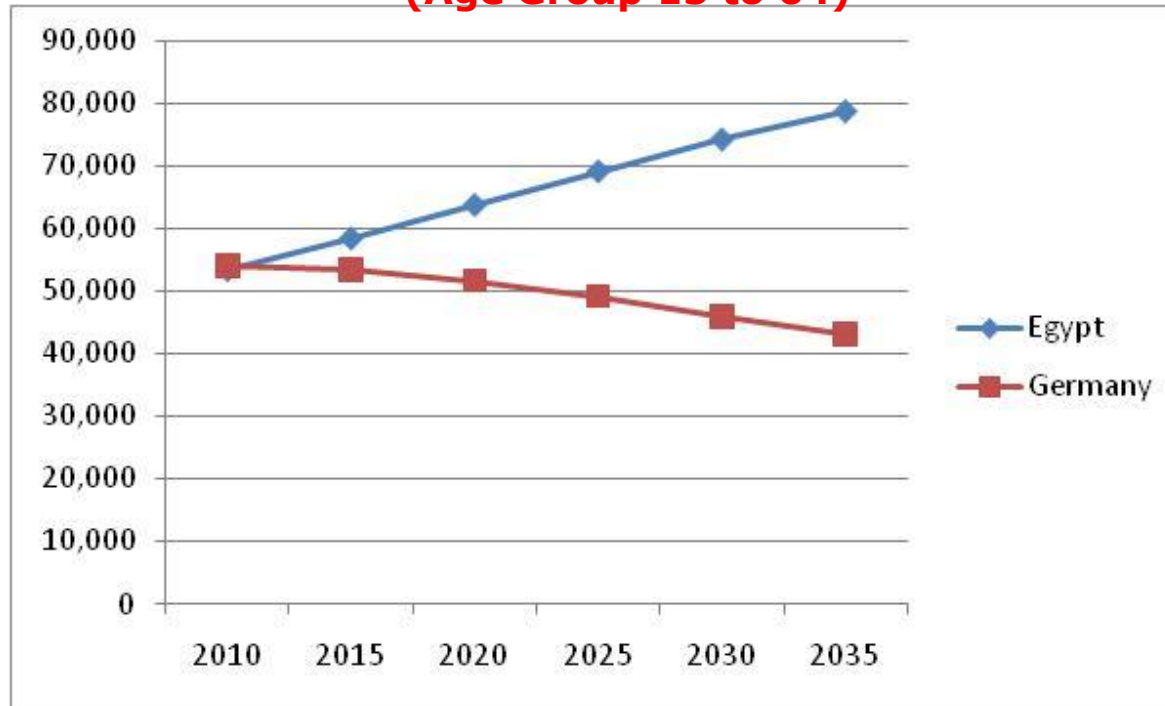

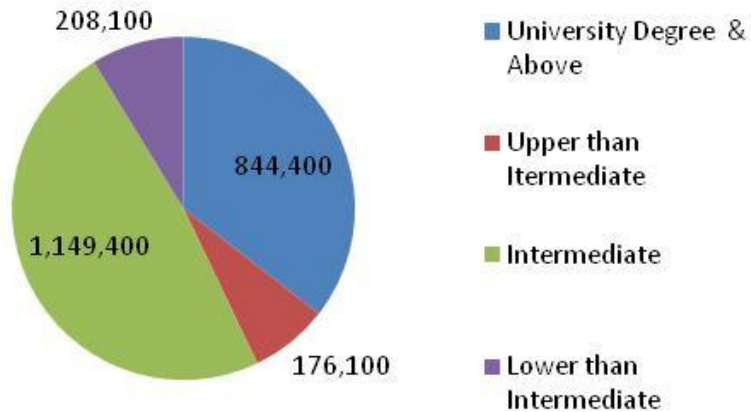

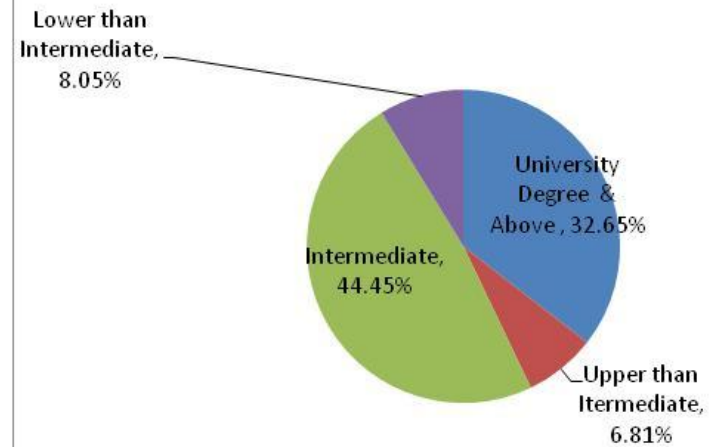

Distribution of Unemployment by Educational Status



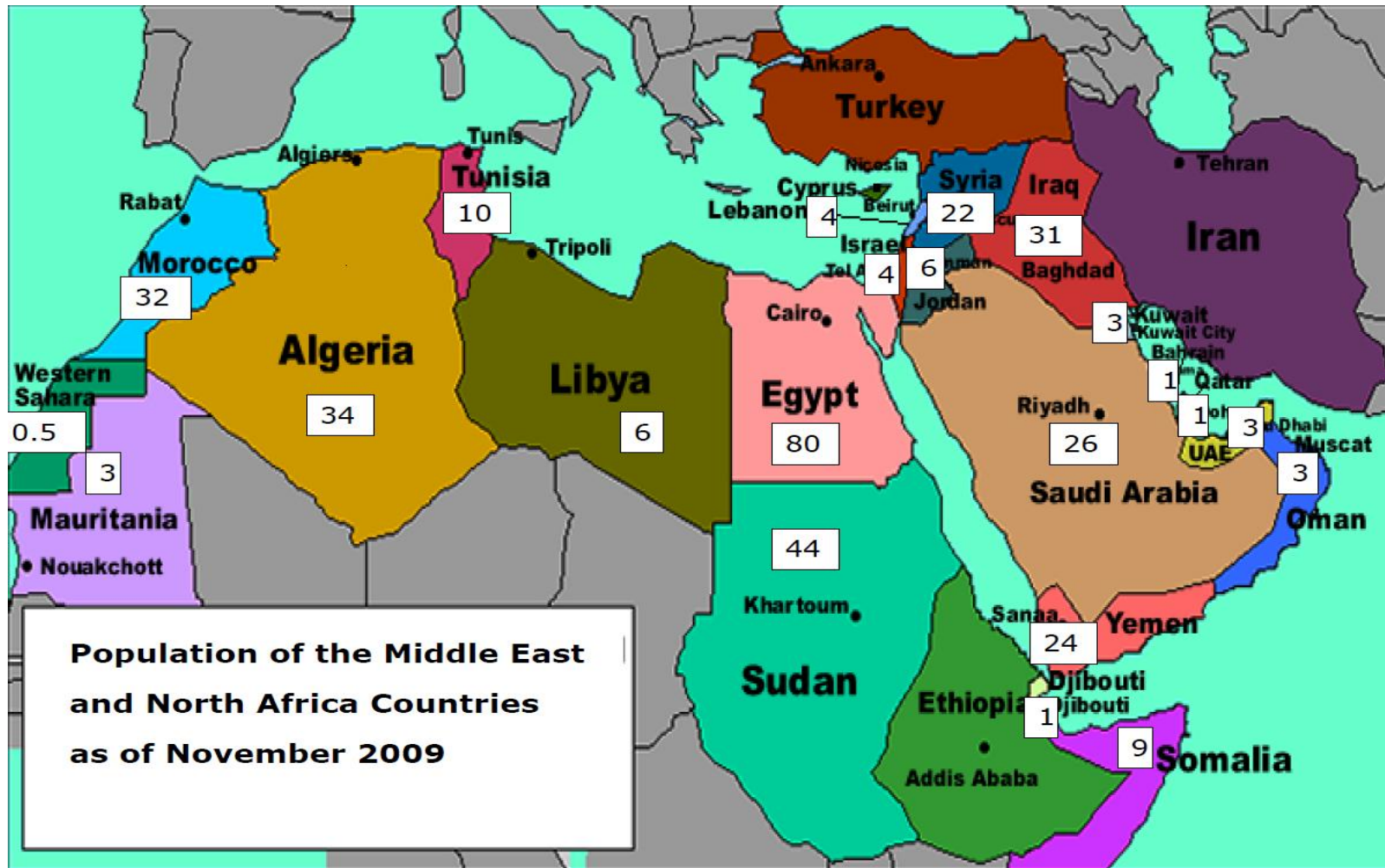
% Distribution of Unemployment by Educational Status

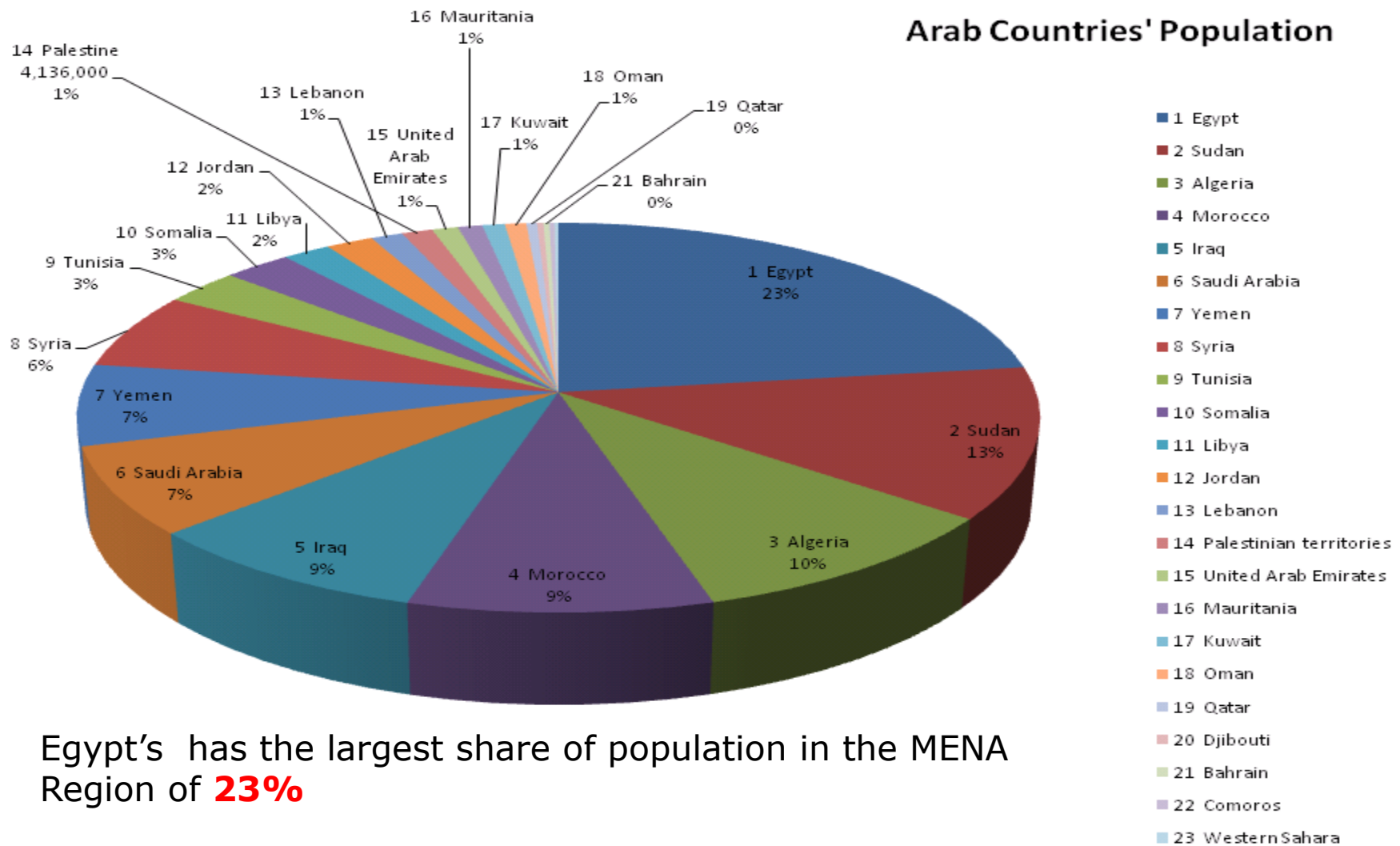


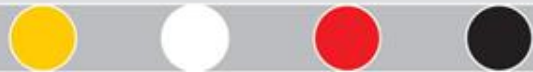
Population of the Middle East and North Africa





Egypt's Share of Population in the Arab World





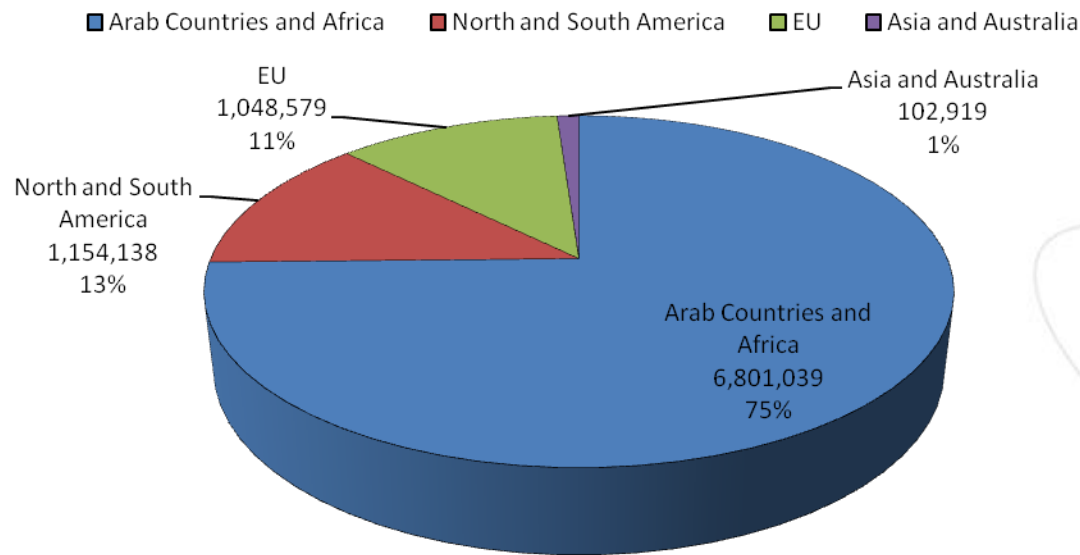
Egypt is the Major Labor Exporter in the MENA Region

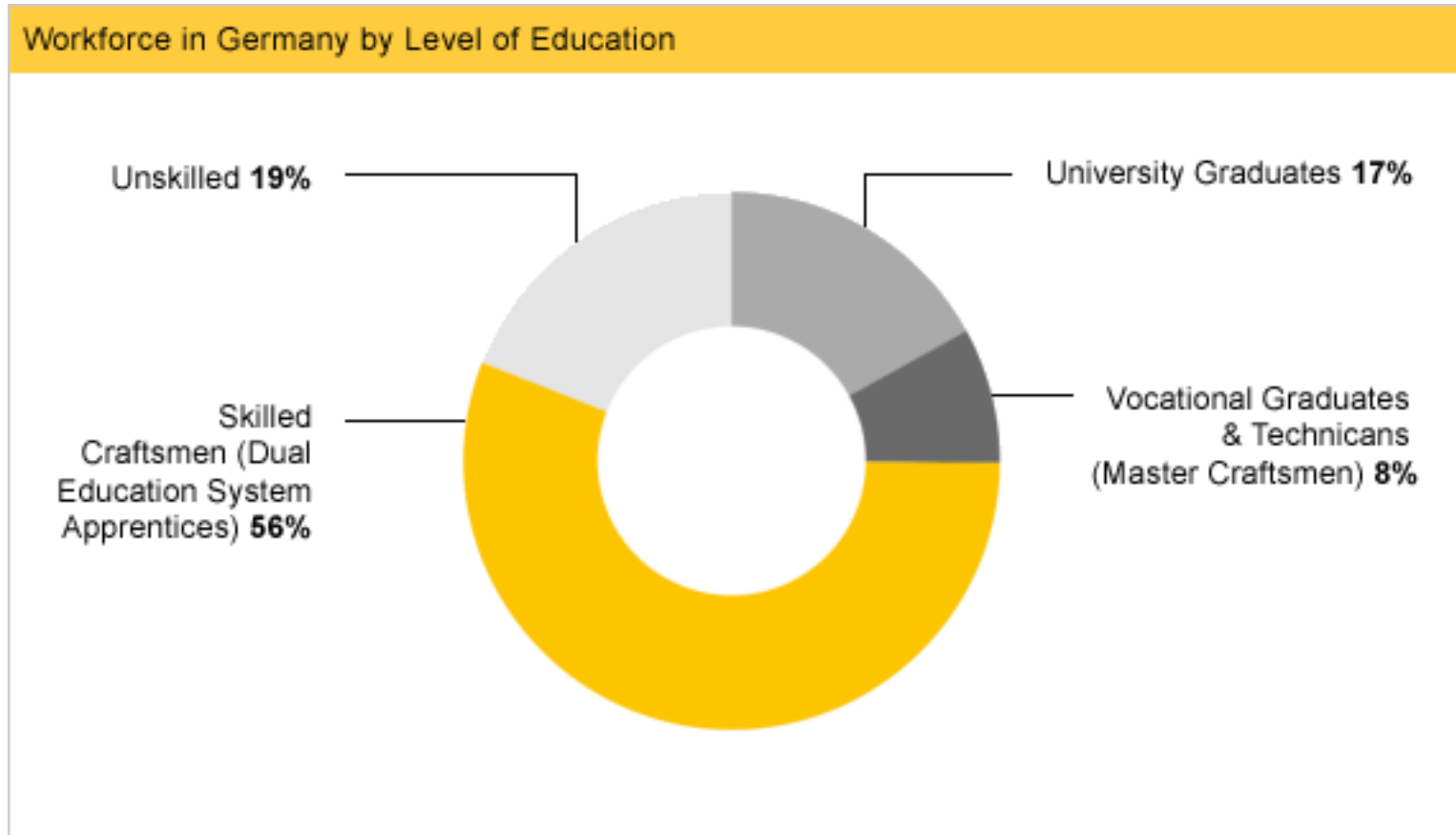

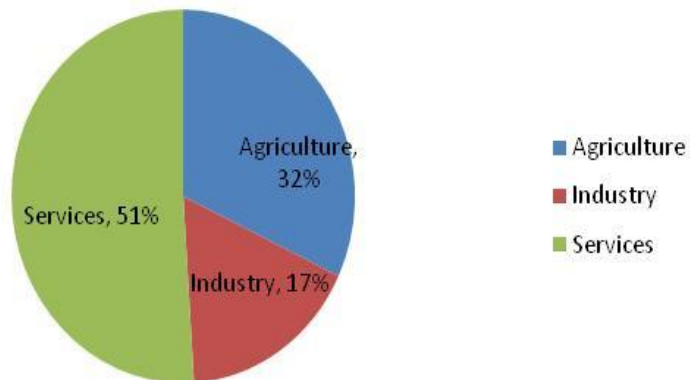


Work force Structure - Germany

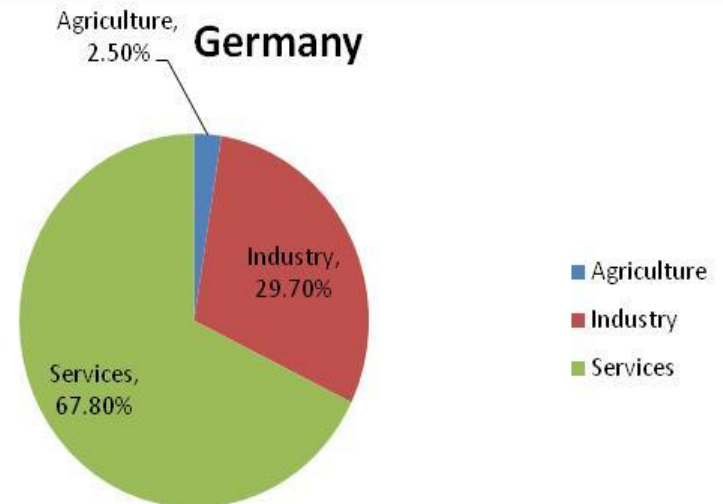


Labor Force By Occupation


